- 4. Increase concentration hours from a total of 32 hours to 35 hours above FLS/FLF/FLG 1123. This will require students to take additional junior-and senior-level coursework in foreign languages
- 5. Change the requirement to take EDS 3673 Secondary Language Arts Education and EDS 4673 Methods in Teaching Language Arts to requirement to take EDS 3663 Secondary Foreign Language Education and EDS 4663/6663 Methods in Foreign Language Teaching.
- 6. Additional core courses will include EN 4403/6403 Introduction to Linguistics and EN 4463/6463 Studies in Second Language Acquisition.
- 7. Prior to admission to Phase II: Teacher Education, students must interview and demonstrate Intermediate-Mid proficiency in the language that they will teach.
- 8. Prior to admission to Phase III: Teacher Licensure, students must have demonstrated Advanced-Low proficiency on the Oral Proficiency Interview.
